experience", "We're a Union contractor and the local apprenticeship starts around 18 plus benefits." and, "this rate assumes a min of 2 years relevant construction experience in commercial trades".

Industry could be overspending \$177B per year, study finds

The average time U.S. construction professionals spend on rework, conflict resolution and looking for project data - issues that can be avoided with improved communication and data management - is costing the industry more than \$177 billion annually, according to a new report from PlanGrid and consultancy FMI Corp.

Out of 600 professionals surveyed for the "Construction Disconnected" report, 336 work in commercial construction, and of the total number of respondents, 49% are general contractors, 36% are in the specialty trades and 15% are owners or developers.

Respondents spend 65% of their time on "optimal" activities that keep project execution on track, which can include communication with stakeholders and optimization of jobsite resources and labor.

The remaining 35% is spent on activities the survey calls "non-optimal" tasks such as hunting down project information, resolving conflicts, and dealing with mistakes that require rework. That translates to more than 14 hours lost per person each week, the report found, or almost two full working days that could be better spent accomplishing "optimal" tasks.

OSHA's <u>Strategic Partnership Program</u> provides opportunities for OSHA to work with stakeholders to eliminate serious hazards and enhance workplace safety and health practices in major corporations, government agencies, private sector industries, and at large construction projects.

- OSHA, the Associated General Contractors of Georgia, Inc., and Brasfield & Gorrie, LLC, entered into a <u>partnership</u> to promote safe work practices during construction of a sales center and warehouse in Union City, Ga. The three-year partnership will address falls, struck-by, caught-in/between, electrical, silica, and noise hazards, as well as heat illness prevention.
- OSHA and Alberici Healthcare, LLC, are partnering to promote safety during the
 construction of a hospital in St. Louis. The <u>partnership</u> will address falls, as well
 as struck-by, caught-in/between, and electrocution hazards, which are the <u>top</u>
 four causes of fatalities in construction.
- OSHA and McCarthy Building Companies, Inc., entered into a partnership to
 protect workers during the construction of a veterans ambulatory care center in
 Omaha, Neb. The <u>partnership</u> will address construction hazards such as falls,
 struck-by, caught-in, and electrocution; educate employees and employers on
 best practices; and encourage worker participation in safety and health
 programs.
